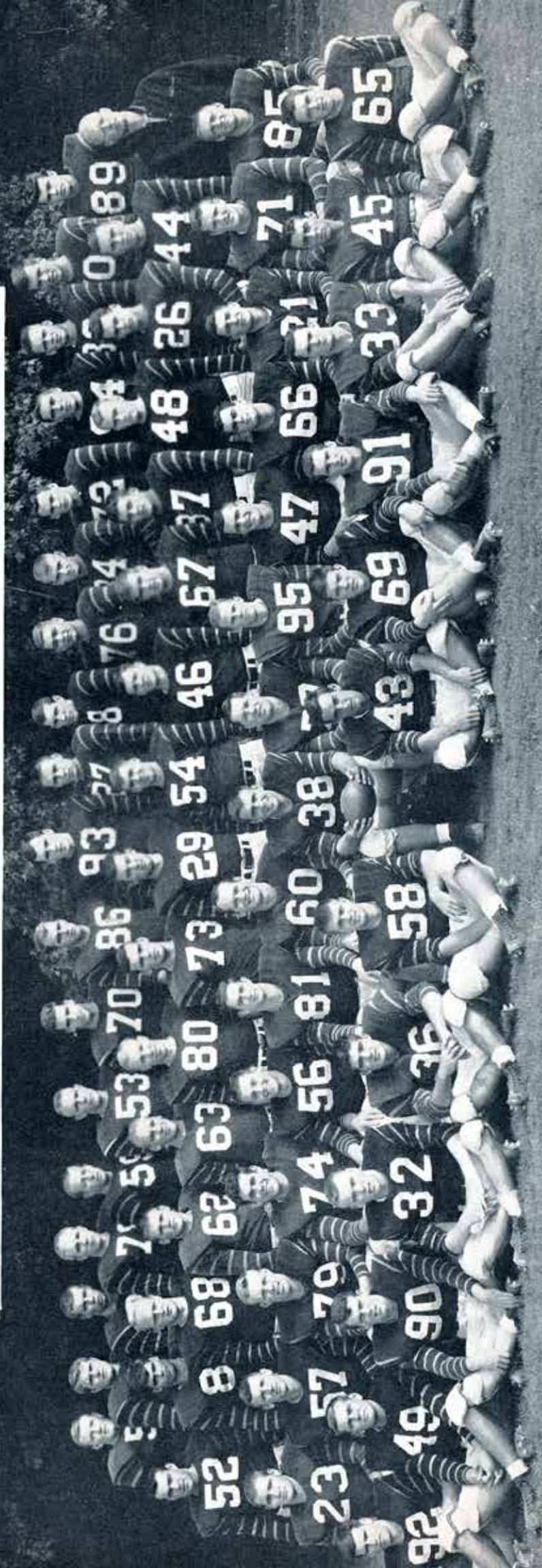

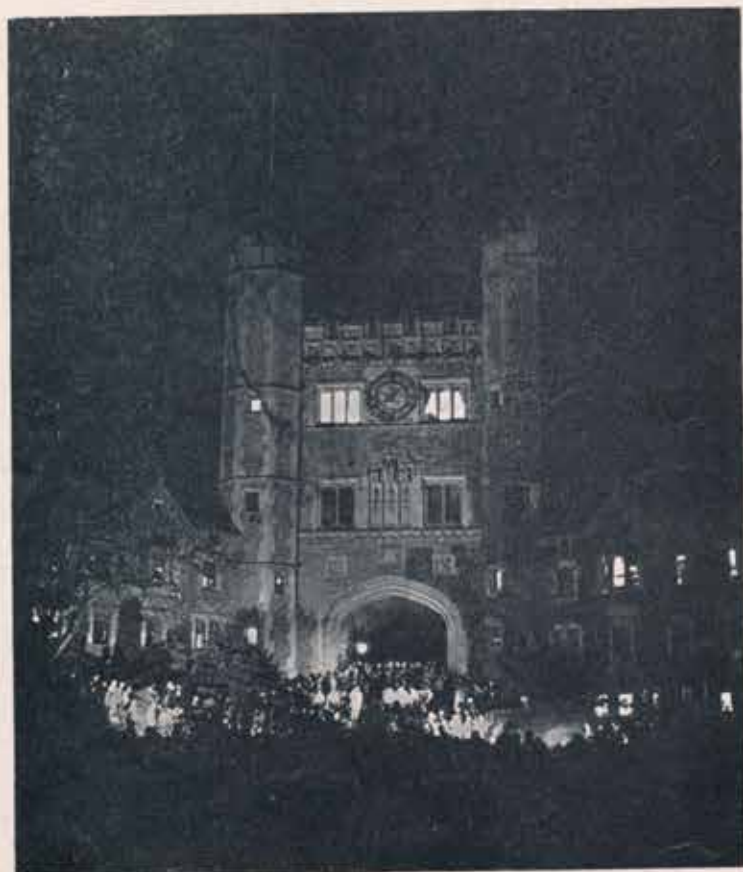


**UP AND OVER**—On the twelfth play following the opening kick-off Captain Fred Tiley, who was playing his first game in the cavernous Yale Bowl, hurdled into the end zone for the Tigers' first score of the afternoon. The Princeton leader accounted for his second touchdown in the early moments of the third period following Jerry Sullican's recovery of a Yale fumble. Two years ago, when the Orange and Black fell in the Bowl, 42-20, Tiley was confined to the sidelines by an injury sustained in early season.



**DURABLE TAILBACK**—Hugh Scott, 180-pound sophomore from Wellesley, Mass., was a driving-force in the devastating single-wing attack that rolled for seven touchdowns. The son of a Harvard alumnus and the grandson of a Yale graduate, Scott is here driving for a first down deep in Blue territory early in the game. He carried the ball on seven of the first 12 plays and by the end of the afternoon had accounted for a total net gain of 123 yards—an average of 6.2 yards per carry.
